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Brief Biography

Jessica Atwooki Kaahwa, Ph.D. has enjoyed a long career in teaching, designing and supervising of practical/research projects and has developed a wealth of resources on African and western conventional theatre history theory and criticism. Dr. Kaahwa started teaching at the current Department of Performing Arts and Film in 1987 and she was formerly appointed as full-time staff in 1990. She recently retired as a Senior Lecturer in 2020, but in 2023 was re-engaged to teach on contract in the same Department. Widely traveled, Dr. Kaahwa holds a Bachelor's degree in Theatre Arts from the University of Benin, Nigeria, a Master of Arts degree in Drama from Makerere University, and a PhD in Theatre Arts from the University of Maryland, College Park, USA.

Dr. Kaahwa has been the architect of a number of national initiatives that have sought to use theatre and media as a constructive force in conflict settings and for health improvement. She has and continues to experiment with theories that expand the discourse on theatre applications. A good example is her recent experimentation with "Theatre for Personal Meaning" and "Theatre for Conflict Analysis. For instance, at the Baptist IDP Camp in Soroti and in Khartoum she focused on how theatre can be employed to locate the individual's voice in a group through a play-back theatre technique. She has also held workshops in Kurdistan's three Institutions of higher learning located at Hawler, Sulaymannia and Dohok on the similar methodology." At the Universities of Amsterdam, Warwick and Helsinki she particularly trained the MA International Performance Research students in practical handling of problems of drug abuse/addicts, racism, homeless, and lawlessness. At the same time, she continues to work on integrating "Processes Theory" into main-stream Applied Theatre practice, which she has developed into training manuals. She is also an accomplished director and actor with a number of stage productions and performances to her credit.

Dr. Kaahwa is an internationally recognized theatre scholar and practitioner and was, in 2011, invited to write and read the "World Theatre Day Speech" of 2011 and consequently became the Chief Guest at the UNESCO - ITI Assembly, Paris, France (March 23, 2011). Ever since, in addition to her teaching commitment at Makerere University, she has continued to travel in honor of her world theatre recognition encouraging and inspiring theatre efforts in diverse theatre cultures and contexts. In addition, 2018 she was honored with the 70th Anniversary Celebration of ITI Life Award Medal. In 2019 she received a highest honor of Theatre Scholar and Practitioner at Cairo International Festival for Contemporary and Experimental Theater, September 2019. Recently received Honorary Membership of African Theatre Association (AfTA) 24th November 2021
